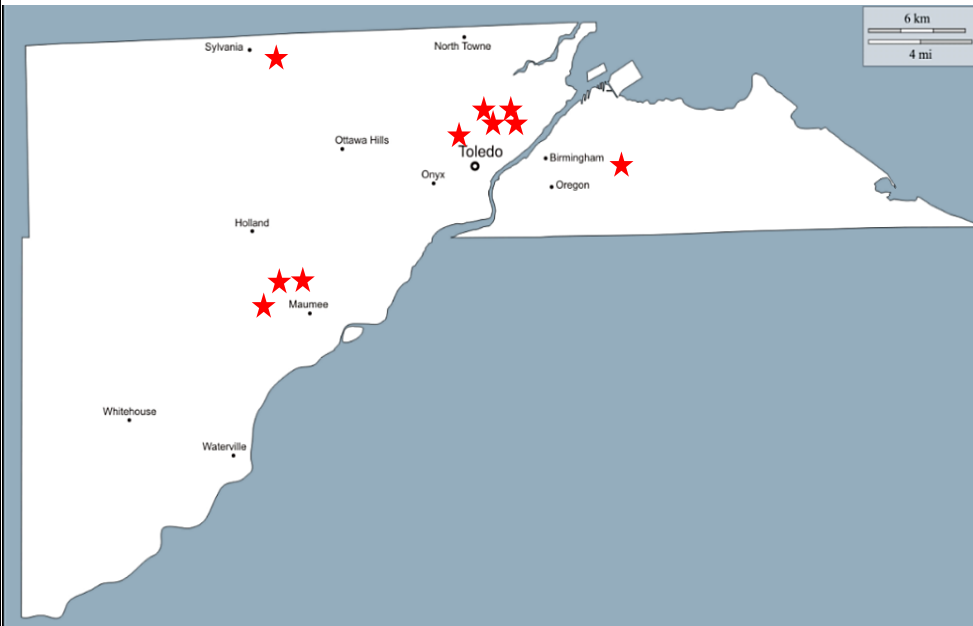

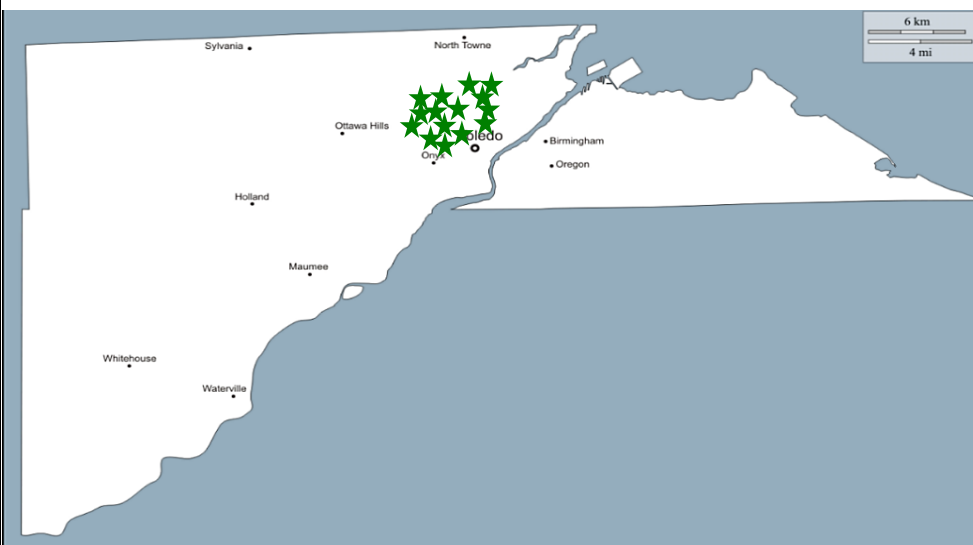
Priority #1-Mental Health

 - 1 location in Toledo
 - Toledo Center for Eating Disorders (private insurance)
 - 1 location in Sylvania
 - ProMedica Health System
 - 3 locations in Toledo
 - Mercy Health Behavioral Health Institute @ St. Charles Hospital
 - 90 psych beds
 - 1 location in Oregon

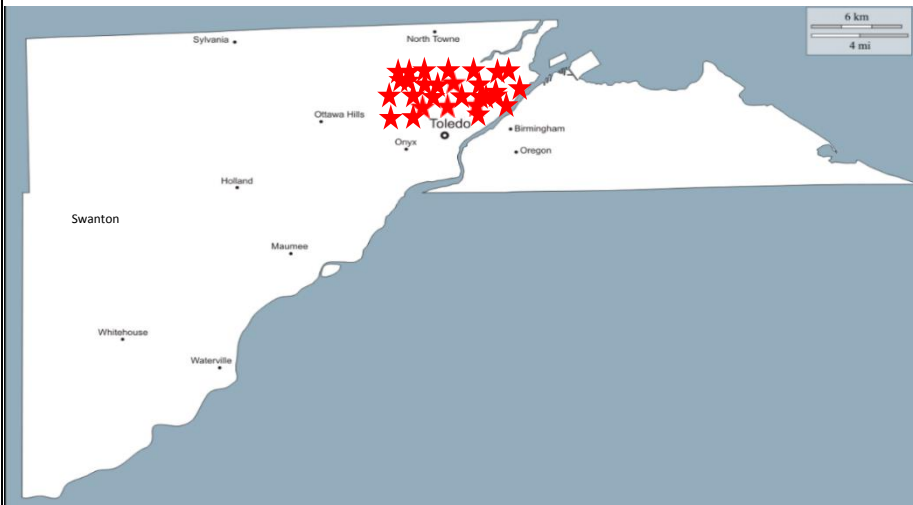

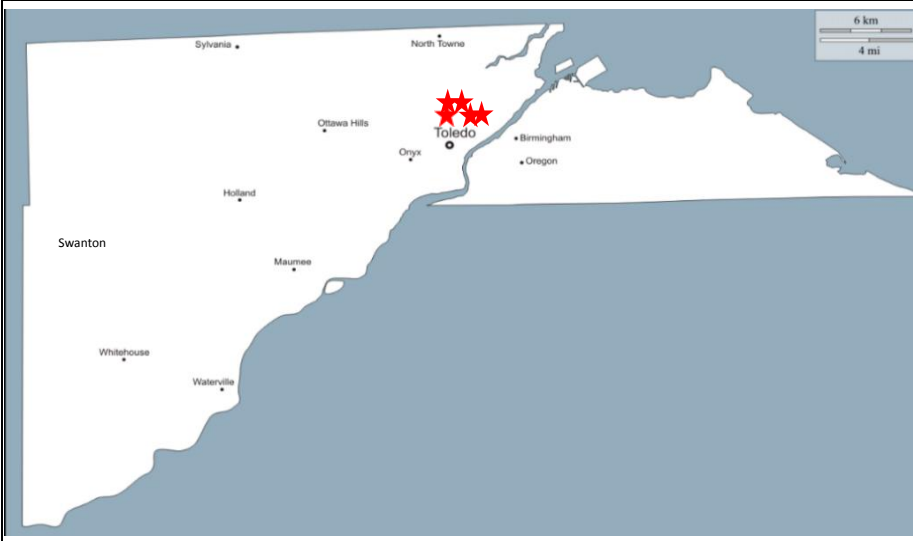

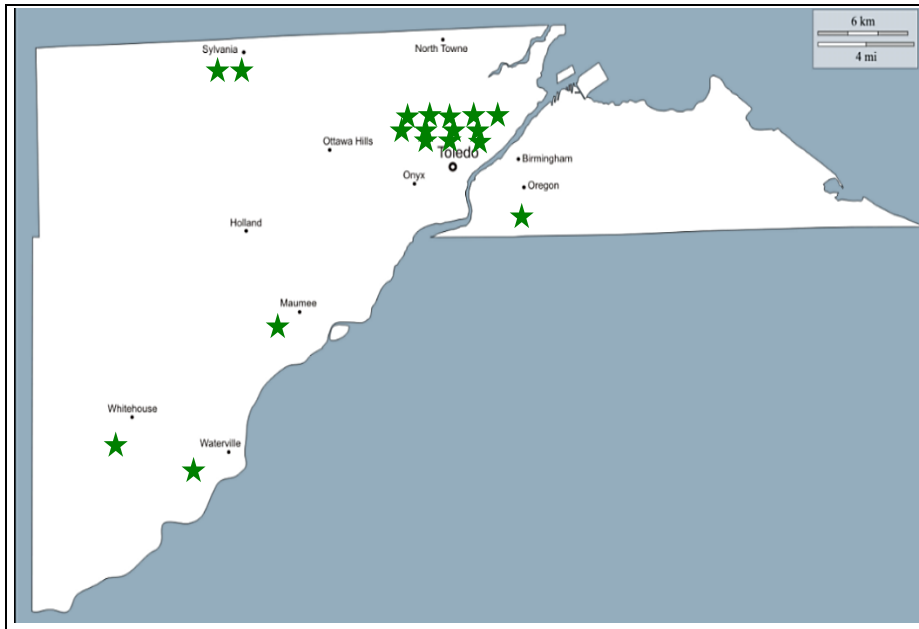
Environmental Factors (Example: prohibiting sales to minors.)



★ Communication & Education: (public education, social media, etc.)

- MHR SB of Lucas County offer the following:
 - Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) Certification trainings to local law enforcement
 - Mental Health First Aid trainings (including train the trainer) to the community
 - Alert Lockdown Inform Counter Evacuate (ALICE) training to the community
 - Continuing education credits (CEUs) for counselors and social workers
 - Recognized Clock Hours (RCHs) through the Ohio Chemical Dependency Professionals Board for certified chemical dependency counselors and certified prevention professionals
